

Hear what a NZ led team is achieving in the Ukraine

In June 2022, our guest speaker, Tenby Powell, formed Kiwi K.A.R.E (Kiwi Aid & Refugee Evacuation), a registered New Zealand Charitable Organisation which has been operating in Ukraine for over 20 months, delivering hundreds of tonnes of numanitarian and medical aid to Red Zone hospitals and front line medical units, and conducting evacuations of civilians.
